American University Students Prefer Rhodos

More than one hundred American students from Pacific Lutheran University (PLU) located in Tacoma, Washington have visited Rhodos for educational purposes. Their first time to the island was in 2011. These programs are considered a high-impact experiential practice that enhances students' capacity for critical thought, written and verbal expression, and intercultural communication. The way to the future requires everyone's participation.

One may consider, the lessons taught by the inscription of Benito Mussolini at the entrance of the palace of the Grand Masters. The natural beauty of the island is undeniable even in winter. However, it is its educational capacity that can improve the global quality of life. This is one of the most important modern contributions Rhodos has to offer.
